A few years later and very happy with his choice, he says: “In Italy this is the absolute top university in economics and the overall quality is also valued highly abroad. This can be seen in the increasing number of international students that choose to study here.”
- Before beginning his experience at Bocconi, Alberto attended the ISPI write out ispi Winter School in 2013-2014, taking a course in “Green Economy and Development.”
- During his first two years at Bocconi, he was a commuting student, with 4-5 hours of travel every day. To allow him to move to Milan without being a financial burden on his parents, Alberto began working by doing an internship (that the University then recognized on his curriculum) and odd jobs, which was a challenge for him. Working and studying at the same time was not easy and led to a slight delay in completing his undergraduate degree. However, the hurdles he encountered – and overcame – provided a true learning experience, which helped him grow and develop.
- In addition to being interested in economics, Alberto is also an athlete. During his BSc, he became a junior member of the Bocconi Golf Club, organizing trips to the “Le Rovendine” golf course. His interests go beyond just golf, however: he plays squash at ‘Sportsman Club,’ he has practiced modern dance and is an expert climber. He also played soccer at a competitive level for 12 years, winning regional championships in Lombardy in 2008-2009 with his team.
- Alberto is the first university graduate in his family. For his MSc, he chose Management, an area that is completely different from his BSc program. He wanted to leave his comfort zone and find new areas of interest for his professional future.
